

*New this year....Theme: "Mustache"

Prizes leading up to the gold medal this year will be mustache themed. Each year the Gold Medal winners will vote on the theme for the next year!

**Again this year....Classroom "Survivor" Games!

Any entire classroom that has the **ENTIRE** class earn the gold medal will get to have their entire class participate in the end of the school year Classroom "Survivor" Games!

The California Reads information letter was sent home with each student today. Attached to the letter is the new "prize map" for this year, so your child can see which prizes they can earn by turning in their reading logs. Their first reading log sheet is also attached to the information letter. **Reading must be submitted on the new "mustache" reading logs.**

The main focus of California Reads is a six month school-wide read-a-thon starting on October 1, 2015, and ending on March 31, 2016. Students will earn prizes as they turn in reading logs to their teachers. Students who complete the program will earn a gold medal at a special Parent invited Award Assembly and will be invited to a Gold Medal Ice Cream party! **To earn a Gold Medal, lower graders must read at least 96 books, and upper graders must read at least 2,400 pages during the six month read-a-thon.** Participants may read on their own, with family or friends, or during one-on-one tutoring sessions. Listening to someone else read, in any language, also counts toward total books/pages read.

We understand that, as parents, you hold high expectations for the quality of education your child received during the school day. By encouraging your child to participate in the read-a-thon, you are expanding upon this learning and taking it into your home, multiplying the school's effectiveness. As we all know, parents are their children's first and most important teachers. Your involvement in the read-a-thon will help your child build literacy skills and develop a lasting love of reading. I look at this program as **parent driven** and teacher encouraged.

Did you know that Dunlap has the only open art studio in the Orcutt School District?



 - Click "Save Details".


