

In the words of Mrs. Francisco, "Fifth grade uses the Chromebooks for every subject. We listen to stories, write essays, make book reports, learn to type, and more during our language arts time. We are learning so much from math and science web sites, especially Khan Academy and Compass where individual needs are addressed. Chromebooks are important for small and large group instruction. They are also necessary for class assessments."

At this time these six teachers share Dunlap's one and only Chromebook cart. For our 2016 Jog-a-thon our theme is "iRun for Laptops." Our hope is to be able to purchase a second Chromebook cart. A second set of Chromebooks would allow our students to have more time with the laptops.


